- Respond to a variety of emergencies to include Structural Fire, Wildland Fires, Swift Water Rescue, Ice Rescue, OHV accidents, Low Slope/Rope Rescue, Motor Vehicle Accidents, Medical and others
- On call 24/7/365

Mission

- Dedicated to enhance and preserve the quality of life, property and the environment through education, leadership, partnerships and effective timely response to all fire emergencies.

Key Service Deliverables

- Attend all dispatched calls in a timely and professional manner
- Prepare accounts payables twice a month and submit for payment
- Provide quarterly statistics report for Council
- Provide Inspections and Investigations
- Purchase and maintain all PPE

Key Service Deliverables

- Process all incident reports
- Prepare billing for Alberta Infrastructure, Various Insurance Companies and bordering Counties
- Fire Prevention Education with Schools and Public
- Engage in public activities – Pumpkin Carving and Santa Day, Snake Hill Slam, Community Food Drives and community fundraising.

Key Service Deliverables

- Provide up-to-date NFPA compliant training
- Recruitment and Retention

Key Statistics

- Respond to an average of 175 – 200 emergencies each year
- Response area is 1500 miles to include Clearwater , Rocky Mountain Forest Reserve and small area of M.D. of Bighorn.
- Maintain Equipment and Fleet of 10 responding units to include Rhino, Quad and River Rescue Boat.

2016 Key Initiatives

- Prepare 2017- 2018 budget
- Complete Training Facility that will allow up-to-date training for all firefighters.
- Initiate FireSmart Program

- Continue working with Forest Resource Improvement Association of Alberta (FRIAA) to obtain Grants to continue FireSmart Initiatives.
