EXCUSE FOR NOT RAKING LEAVES THIS FALL

In fact there are three reasons that *not* raking leaves can benefit you, your lawn, and the environment, too.

How? By mulching leaves, rather than painstakingly raking and bagging every last one. Mulching doesn't require any special equipment, just a regular lawn mower with the bag removed. It takes a fraction of the time that raking would, with the added benefit of replacing beneficial nutrients back into your lawn to nourish it for next spring.

The ideal time to start mulching those leaves is while you can still see some grass through the leaf covering – put it off too long and you may end up with mulch that covers your lawn rather than blending into it. Too much mulch means blocked sunlight, and dead grass, but doing smaller batches every week or so allows the leaves to fall between the blades of grass and onto the soil below.

To mulch, adjust your mower to medium/high setting, and start taking slow passes across the lawn just like you would mow grass. The mower blades finely chop the leaves, and spray them back onto the lawn. I like to do a final pass on a low setting to tidy things up a bit, but it's not strictly necessary.

The end result is a lawn covered with a fine smattering of shredded leaves – it's not immaculate, but neither is a raked lawn where one strong breeze blasts you right back to square one.

PUBLIC HEARING

PUBLIC HEARING BY-LAW NO. 12.17 LAND USE BYLAW AMENDMENT

A Public Hearing will be held on Tuesday, November 14, 2017, at 6:00 p.m. in the Town of Sundre Council Chambers.

The purpose of Bylaw 12.17 is to provide administrative changes to the Town of Sundre Land Use Bylaw No. 705. Streamlining the subdivision and development processes include shifting the development authority for subdivision and development applications to the administration for decision. The development authority, for the most part, would rest with the Chief Administrative Officer, Manager of Planning and Development, and designated Development and Subdivision Officers. The amendments include a mechanism to refer the more complex applications to Council for consideration and direction, before a decision is made. These amendments, together with the streamlined process, will provide administrative efficiencies for applicants and staff by improving customer service and the timing for application processing. It also will free up time so staff can focus better on customer service and addressing other important planning matters. Other changes include adding definitions for clarification purposes and a new Use.

A copy of the proposed Bylaw may be inspected by the public during regular office hours, 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday to Friday at the Town Office (717 Main Avenue W.), or can be found on the Town's website (www.sundre.com). Please contact the Town Office if you would like an opportunity to review and provide input on the proposed amendments prior to the Public Hearing.

The Public Hearing will be held at the Town of Sundre Council Chambers, on Tuesday, November 14, 2017, commencing at 6:00 pm with procedures in accordance with the Town of Sundre Council Procedural Bylaw 14.17 and amendments thereto.

Any person who claims to be affected by the bylaw may present suggestions or concerns by making a submission to the public hearing. Written submissions to the Public Hearing or the name of any person wishing to make an oral presentation at the Public Hearing must be received by the Planning and Development Department prior to 12:00 noon on Wednesday, November 8, 2017 as outlined in Bylaw #14.17 and amendments thereto. If your written submission is not received by this time, please provide fifteen (15) copies for distribution at the Public Hearing. Each person or group representative, wishing to address Council at the Public Hearing shall complete their verbal presentation within five (5) minutes.

Please note that written submissions will become public documents once submitted to the Town, unless otherwise requested.
